NEWS ITEMS

James Croke, Assoc. Professor at Florida State University, Tallahassee, is supervising family counseling for this quarter and will be doing so through the next quarter.

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CITY NEWS

A fourth Family Education Center, co-sponsored by the M.S.I.P. is being organized at Dayton Ave. Presbyterian Church in the heart of the black ghetto in St. Paul, Minn. The co-directors will be Don and Rose Crainnell.

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Negotiations are under way with the model cities program in Minneapolis for a full time education center.

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Training is available in a number of levels in Minneapolis. There is a course in Fundamentals of Adlerian Psy. taught by Jean and Bob Willhite and Bob Bartholow are teaching a class on Life Style Analysis. As part of the Court Services Center, the first portion of Sat. A.M. is a public lecture on basic principles, much as Ray Lowe used to do in Eugene, Oregon.

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A practicum is also offered in Family Counseling for qualified professionals who obtain their training in all of the currently operating centers. At this time there are about ten people in the practicum.

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Mim and Bill Pew are currently conducting a series of sex education seminars for Junior High School students at Incarnation Church in St. Paul, Minn. They also conducted a full day workshop Nov. 23 for parents at the Lutheran Social Service in Minneapolis, Minn.

Plans were made for Mr. Border to train study group leaders beginning February 9 with the first meeting at his home. It is anticipated that the study groups will get underway the first week in March.
