MODEL COUNSELING PROJECT

The Wheeling Project has been funded under Title III ESEA 89 - 10, U. S. Office of Education. This will serve as a model elementary school counseling program in five counties of northwestern West Virginia. Dr. Edward Stormer, John McCandless, Jim Mondirne, and Pat McGonigal will appear at different school settings on different days to demonstrate individual counseling, children's group counseling, and parent group sessions.

The Adlerians in America have weathered a long period of obscurity and being considered superficial in their approach to psychology. The news, especially on the issues of activities in Adlerian Psychology, seems to indicate that more and more professionals, as well as lay people are understanding and relating to the concept of purposeful goal-directed behavior rather than the old mechanistic instinctive concepts.

INTERNATIONAL ADLERIAN SUMMER SCHOOL

W. L. Pew, M. D.

The 1969 International Adlerian Summer School (previously conducted in Holland, Denmark, and Oregon) was held August 10 - 23, 1969, under the directorship of Rudolf Dreikurs in the new Greek Orthodox Academy remotely located on the Island of Crete. Over 150 participants representing over a dozen countries and a multitude of linguistic and cultural backgrounds attended. Staff included Dr. and Mrs. Dreikurs (U.S.), Dr. and Mrs. Pew (U.S.), Dr. Nira Kefjr (France and Israel), Dr. Betty Miller (U.S.), Roni Silberman (Israel), Marta Gotlieb (Israel), Zeev Lavie (Israel), Miriam Spielman (Israel), Juliet Cavadas (Greece), Frosso Kenis (Greece), Achi Yatom (Israel), Judy Eloul (Israel), Bernice Grunwald (U.S.), Ruth Holger-Nielsen (Denmark), Eleanor Redwin (U.S.), Erik Blumenthal (Germany & Switzerland).

Registrants came from many backgrounds: social work, psychology, medicine, education, psychiatry, vocational rehabilitation, nursing, psycho-pharmacology, behavioral science research, the clergy, theology, administration, government, and many other professional fields not directly related to the behavioral sciences as well as many concerned laymen.

The days were heavily scheduled with lectures, special interest groups, personal problem groups, and demonstrations.

Translation was necessary for large lectures and demonstrations, but language barriers were remarkably overcome in the small groups. This intensive experience, living, eating, breathing Adlerian psychology day and night in such an isolated retreat could probably not be duplicated in any other way. Heterogeneity was an expected bonus for we had an age range from 18 to 80, educational range from high school to post doctoral and a range in Adlerian sophistication -- from the most highly trained to those for whom this was the first exposure to Individual

Psychology. Everyone had something to contribute and we lived through many trials and tribulations together. Having arrived as a motley group of strangers, we left the island as close friends.

A school promoting democratic principles in a conservative political atmosphere provided a unique contrast and challenging questions and discussion. Obviously it was not our purpose to change the Greek government, but we found the Greek people hungry for every idea of how to put democratic principles into everyday living, in the home, in the classroom, at work. Clearly the vestiges of an autocratic past in Greek interpersonal relationships cannot be attributed to the current regime. Greek parents and teachers find themselves faced with the same kinds of problems as their counterparts in other Western nations. A demonstration of family counseling with a priest and his family from Crete gave Dr. Dreikurs a good opportunity to show the universality of the bankruptcy of autocratic child-rearing methods. The follow-up one week later undoubtedly contributed to the intense interest of the clergy who will now meet with families in their parishes and study together the principles of democratic family living.

The Academy is only a year old and is founded on the assumption that dialogue provides a basis for better human understanding, and the improvement of human relations. Ours was the first large conference and the facilities were taxed, but volunteer staff under the leadership of Dr. Papaderos (who worked so hard he got sick) met the challenge with joy and humor. From the Israelis came a proposal enthusiastically proffered by Dr. Dreikurs and accepted by the Bishop that representatives from Israel and Egypt could perhaps experience some of the same kinds of benefits that we did if they could live together in the Academy for an extended conference. A date has been set for May, 1970.

The far-reaching effects of this summer school are hard to predict. In several countries or regions new Adlerian groups will be forming, the most imminent being

a Greek Society for Adlerian Study, under the leadership of Frosso Kenis and Juliet Cavadas and many other Greek registrants. Two of Dr. Dreikurs' books have already been promoted into Greek by Mrs. Cavadas and arrangements care underway to translate other Adlerian books.
