ADLER INSTITUTE HAS NEW DIRECTOR.

Since the resignation last spring of Dr. Dreikurs, four members of the Institute's Board of Directors have rotated as acting Directors of the Institute. During this time, a search was conducted for a full-time Director, and the choice was recently made. On February 1, Eugene J. McClory assumed this position.

Mr. McClory comes to us from the Office of Child Development, an agency of the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, where he has served as the National and Regional Director of educational programs. His administrative experience in the field of education, including liaison work with academic institutions, the establishment

of programs for the training of para-professionals as well as professionals in addition to his graduate education and experience in Psychology, bode well for the growth and development of the Institute.

FOCUS ON ADLERIAN APPROACHES. This year's Brief Psychotherapy Conference sponsored by the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, Univer-

sity Health Sciences, The Chicago Medical School and Mount Sinai Hospital Medical Center emphasized Adlerian techniques in honor of the centennial of Alfred Adler's birth. The conference also honored Rudolf Dreikurs, Emeritus Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences. The program besides Dr. Dreikurs featured Heinz Ansbacher, Dr. and Mrs. Pew, Kurt Adler, Helene Papanek, Bernard Shulman, Walter O'Connell, Harold Mosak, Robert Powers, and Bina Rosenburg. H.H. Garner and Heinz Ansbacher were Co-Directors of the conference.

THE FIRST. The First National Elementary School Counselors Conference, was held at the Hickory Elementary School, Park Forest South, Saturday, March 25. Demonstrations were presented by Ed Stormer, Oscar Christensen, Don Dinkmeyer, and Manford Sonstegard of Family Counseling, group counseling with children, and parent groups.

AAI - CHICAGO WORKSHOP. "Contributions of Adlerian Psychology to Counseling" workshop sponsored by the Alfred Adler Institute of Chicago was held at the Palmer House, Sunday, March 26. The demonstrations, after an introductory presentation of the Adlerian counseling process by Don Dinkmeyer, by Bernard Shulman, Mosak and Powers were practical and instructive. The demonstration of family counseling scheduled for Dr. Dreikurs was admitted to the hospital Sunday morning and thus unable to participate.

NEW YORK. Queens College, New York City as an expression of its appreciation to Dr. Ernst Papanek for his many years of professional service has appointed him Professor Emeritus in Education. DR. HELENE PAPANEK. Besides the courses she teaches at the Alfred Adler Institute is supervisor in Marital Therapy for the American Institute for Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis. Recently she presented Adlerian Principles for Individual Psychology and Psychotherapy at the Training Institute for Mental Health Practitioners. The Marriage and Family Counselors Training Program at AAI was begun in March of this year under Helene's direction with the ordained efforts of Marvin Nelson, Danica Deutsch, Evelyn Marks, Alexandria Adler, Lucia Radl, Ruth Ronall, Gerd Fenchel and Ruth Larson.

SUMMER WORKSHOP. Three summer workshops dealing with Adlerian counseling and consultation techniques are being sponsored by the Counseling Bureau at the University of South Carolina during the coming summer. These workshops are partially funded under a Federal grant and the registration fee for each workshop is thirty dollars. Bob Powers and Frank Walton will staff two two-week workshops devoted to "Child Guidance and Parent Consultation".

These workshops are scheduled July 5 to July 15 at the main campus in Columbia, S.C., and August 7 to 18 at the Coastal Carolina Campus at Conway, S.C. Don Dinkmeyer and Walton will staff a one-week workshop in Columbia, S.C., from July 24 to 29. This workshop will involve an introduction to use of the life style and to use of groups in modifying student, teacher, and parent behavior. WILMINGTON REPORTS. One of our Wilmington reporters filed this report: "The Spring Session of the FEC of Delaware is in full swing. Interest is running very high in our activities as is indicated by high attendance figures. The first session on February 12 drew 150 people. F.E.C. Administrator this year is Yvonne Grossi. Study groups are growing faster than anticipated and it is hard to keep up with the demand for leaders.

Emphasis for some of these study groups will be on parents of nursery school children. 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NEW COURSE AT ALFRED ADLER INSTITUTE
