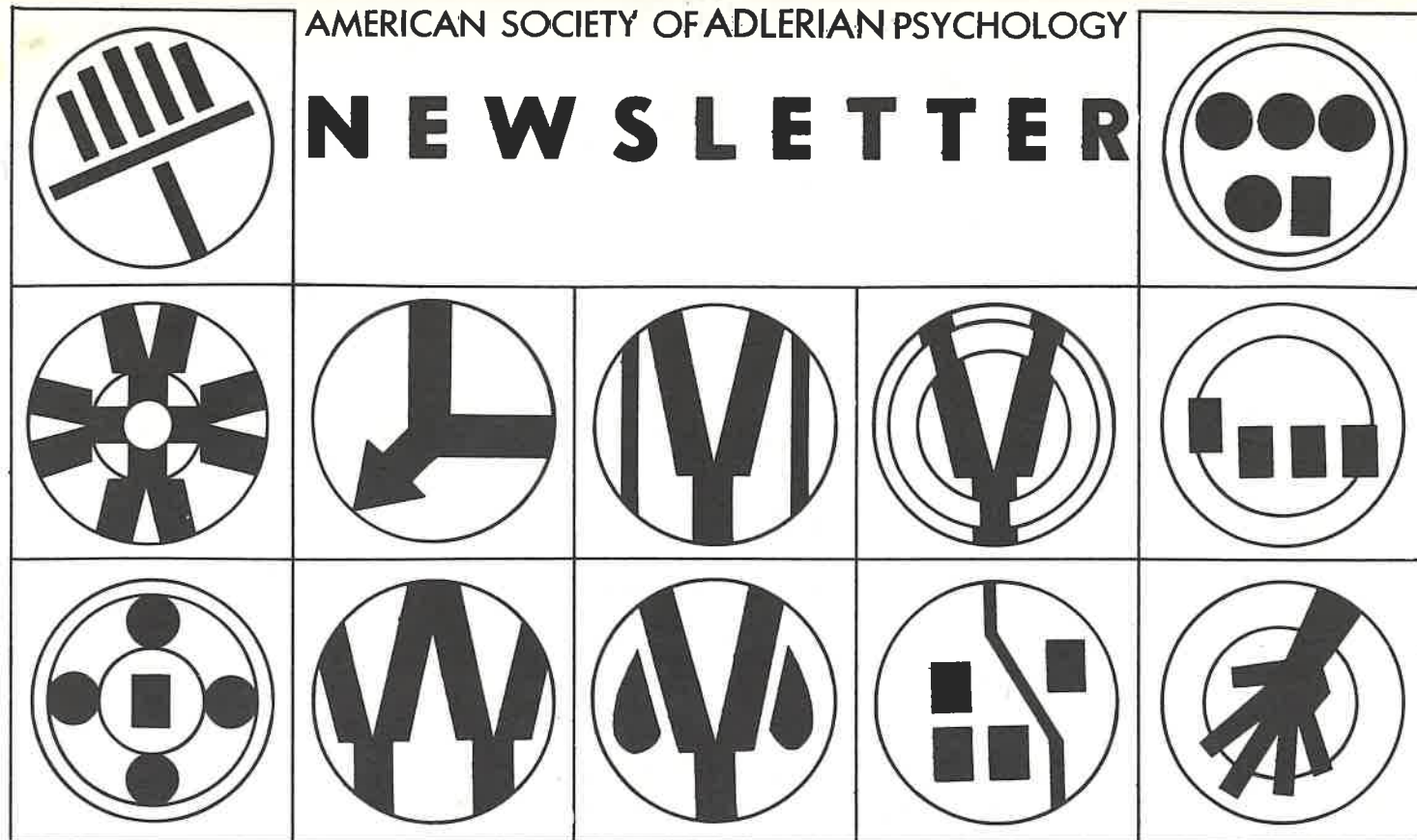

The Indiana Individual Psychology Association announces the availability of video-tape demonstrations of Dr. Bernard Shulman interviewing six different patients in therapeutic interviews. The tapes are approximately two hours in length. The diagnostic categories vary: (1) Hysteria Neurosis with hallucinations; (2) Obsessive-Compulsive Personality with Psycho-Physiologic features; (3) Hysteria Personality plus Psycho-Physiologic features; (4) Excessive Alcohol Ingestion: Neurotic Depression; (5) Hysterical Personality with Anxiety Neurosis; and (6) Explosive Personality.

The tapes are all of excellent quality and demonstrate various psychotherapeutic motivating methods. In order to cover the large investment our newly formed society has made for these films, we are asking a rental fee of \$15.00 per session, plus mailing expenses. For copying purposes, the film may be borrowed for a fee of \$50.00. In addition to the above; cassette tapes are available of the same interviews. The price being \$5.00 per rental and \$7.50 for a purchase.

"WHO REPRESENTS THE CHILDREN

Concern about children's mental health in our increasingly confusing society has become an issue in the federal government. Many public and private agencies have as their goal the improvement of children's mental health, but implementation and coordination of their efforts is often ineffective or even non-existent. As a result of the 1970 White House Conference on Children, there is now a new National Center for Child Advocacy in the HEW's Office of Child Development. It includes a unit designed to respond to citizen and parental concerns about children, a secretariat to gather information on children's programs, and a division to advocate, or serve as ombudsman, for children. Jean Reynolds is the new coordinator... The center's aim is the establishment of child advocacy systems at all levels, neighborhood, local, state, and national. Participation and representation in these advocacy bodies should include professionals, laymen, parents and consumers...

If you have comments, suggestions, or innovations in the area of child advocacy please submit in brief article form or as announcements to the Editor. A forthcoming issue of The School Psychologist will publish a collection of material on this very important issue.

IN MEMORIAM

Dr. Antos C. Rancurello, born December 18, 1921, in S. Damiano Marca, Italy, died suddenly on June 28, 1972, in Dayton, Ohio. Dr. Rancurello received his B.A. and Ph.D. degrees in philosophy in Italy. In 1966 he was awarded a Ph.D. degree in psychology from Loyola University of Chicago. He was full professor and director of graduate clinical training at the University of Dayton. He also maintained a private practice and was a clinical psychologist at the Dayton Mental Health Center. In 1966, his book, entitled A Study of Franz Brentano was published.

Dr. Rancurello had a strong commitment to Adlerian psychology. He trained his students thoroughly in both the theoretical and practical aspects of Adler's holistic and teleological conception of man and was extending this work toward the area of existential phenomenological psychology at the time of his death.

He is survived by his wife, Carmella, and five children.

President Francesco Parenti of the Italian Association for Individual Psychology, Piazza Irnerico 2, 20146 Milano stated in a recent letter to Dr. Sonstegard the following:

"The I.A.I.P. has been started in 1969 to bring together physicians and psychologists oriented towards Adler lines, who had been working in Italy up to that time without the connection of an association. Since when it was started, our Association has been promoting a number of symposia, debates and lectures (among which a celebration on occasion of Adler centennial) and has been organizing each year a lecture course and monthly meetings of Members for discussion of cases."

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Review of Hapi '72

Hapi '72, a two-week long Adlerian Summer Institute met August 21-31, at the Kaimana Beach Hotel in Honolulu. Participants included eight faculty, two locals - Drs. Harold Kozuma and Raymond Corsini, three mainlanders - Dr. and Mrs. Pew and Dr. Rowena Ansbacher, and three visitors from Israel, Dr. Nira K'fir, Shula Alsheik, and Hadassa Ne'eman. The student body consisted of 98 people, sixteen from the mainland and eighty-two locals. The visiting students came from Missouri, Ohio, New York, Canada, Kansas, Arizona, California and Illinois. The whole Institute was considered a great success by everyone. Major events of the Institute were Adlerian Family Counseling by Bill and Mim Pew and by Ray Corsini; demonstrations of life style interviewing by Bill Pew; a lecture on mini life-style assessment of priorities by Nira K'fir; lectures on Adler and on Individual Psychology theory by Rowena Ansbacher; discussion group on Rational Education led by Ray Corsini. All faculty members ran personal development groups during the afternoons. In the evenings a variety of group meetings were held, mostly informal, including a leaderless discussion group, an encounter group, a "rap" group and a final summing-up group.
