## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The start of a new academic year reminds me of the continued opportunity to spread the use of Adlerian techniques in our schools. While helpful courses for teachers are provided at the various Alfred Adler Institutes, we can greatly increase our impact upon the schools by establishing in our communities a basic course devoted to applications of Adlerian Psychology in the schools. Community colleges and regional branches of state universities often have the sort of flexibility and interest in community service that lends itself to the support of such a course.

Now is the time to lay the ground work so that such a course may be approved for offering in the Spring or Summer. Local societies without a nearby Alfred Adler Institute may wish to work for the establishment of such a course in their community. Word of such a "practical" course spreads rapidly among teachers, just as the reputation of parent study groups spreads rapidly in a community. In fact, such courses for teachers often bring about the fringe benefit of the establishment of a parent study group in a school to which the teacher returns.

Teachers, especially high school teachers, are more cognizant than ever of their inability to win the cooperation of students. Thus, what we have to offer is more marketable than ever.

Before closing, a special thank you on behalf of the society is in order to Manford Sonstegard and James Bitter for their work in publishing the back copy of the INDIVIDUAL PSYCHOLOGIST. Congratulations to Udelle Friedland and her staff for the publication of their first issue of the IP.

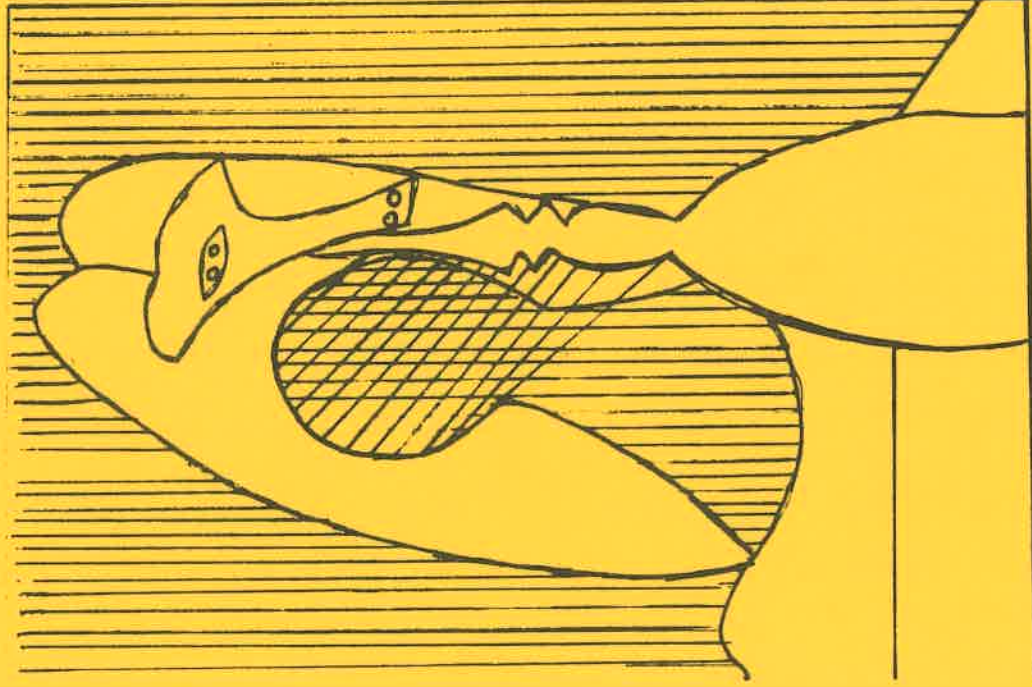
