### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear fellow members:

The Executive Committee met September 17-18. The reorganization has dominated our activities this past year. The constitutional changes, which are necessary to implement the reorganization, have been sent to all members of the society for their vote. I hope each of you will see fit to vote your support to the changes brought about through the dedicated work of your delegates. In one sense there is closure, but in another sense there is a beginning. There is a beginning in the form of the development of interest sections.

Interest section development is underway and is directed towards the goal of enhancing professional growth and increasing the development and spread of principles and techniques of Individual Psychology by drawing together Adlerians with similar professional interests.

Further regional development is being encouraged with recommended increased regional meetings and networking. Hopefully this networking will

encourage these Adlerians to be a support system to one another and subsequently encourage their alliance with the central organization, NASAP.

I must admit I'm feeling very connected with Adlerians, having three weekends in a row scheduled for Adlerian meetings: Executive Committee in Chicago, The S.C. Conference of Adlerian Psychology in Mrytle Beach, and the Region III meeting in Atlanta. The S.C. Conference of Adlerian Psychology was our first state conference and it was very successful. The 125 participants were enthusiastic about the opportunity to connect with one another and to grow professionally. We agreed to return to Myrtle Beach, September 14-16, 1984 for our second meeting. I'm also anticipating a good meeting in Atlanta!

Looking ahead, the Delegate Assembly will meet November 4-6. This will be the first Delegate Assembly apart from the semi-annual meeting. We are meeting in the Alfred Adler Institute in Chicago.



### LETTERS

Correction: Eleanore Redwin Memorial

Edwardsville, IL September 10, 1983

I was gratified to read in the September-October issue of the Newsletter that my friend, Eleanore Redwin, was honored with a memorial tribute. Since my childhood I have known Elly, whose long illness and death last spring was a loss not only to her friends and loved ones, but also to the Adlerian world. However, please note an error in the tribute, which stated that "in 1945 she instituted the first Child Guidance Center in Chicago." In the Terner and Pew biography of Rudolf Dreikurs (The Courage to be Imperfect), on pages 166-167,

Elly's work at the Chicago centers is described, and on pages 146-155 the history of the Chicago centers is given. Rudolf Dreikurs began a long-term and successful Child Guidance Center at the Abraham Lincoln Center in 1939. It was a center I visited often before World War II. Although Elly was a very important person in the Child Guidance Center development in Chicago, it was not she who started the movement nor was the beginning of the Child Guidance Centers as late as 1945. Thank you for correcting this in the Newsletter.

# Psychodrama in Chicago

Chicago, Illinois will be the site of the First Midwest Psychodrama Training Institute and Conference in the Americana Congress Hotel, November 11 through 13, 1983. This combined meeting of training and conferencing is made possible through the sponsorship of Governor's State University. The Training Institute will be conducted during the day of Friday, November 11 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and will feature five certified Psychodrama trainers, each demonstrating his/her particular style of directing. The Conference proper will begin in the evening of the 11th and will include a Sociodrama directed by Ann Hale of Roanoke, Virginia.

Scholarship Program for 1984

The Board of Directors of the International Committee for Adlerian Summer Schools and Institutes (ICASSI) has approved a special fund to provide scholarships for professionals, lay persons and graduate students involved in Adlerian/Dreikursian psychology. Three memorial scholarships will cover tuition, board and room at ICASSI '84 Summer Institute in Siena, Italy.

- (1) The Rudolf Dreikurs Memorial Scholarship is to be awarded to a professional person already practicing in the field. Applications should include: academic background; leadership potential; commitment for developing a project promoting Individual Psychology; a brief description of your proposal; describe your present involvement in Individual Psychology, if any; references.
- (2) The Ruth Holger-Nielson Memorial Scholarship is to be awarded to a lay person active in family education and counseling centers. Applications should include: commitment and proposal; leadership potential; past and present involvement in Individual Psychology; references.
- (3) The W.L. "Bill" Pew Memorial Scholarship is to be awarded to a graduate student preparing for a professional career. Applications should include: commitment for developing a project in the community or university or conduct some action research in Individual Psychology; a brief description of proposal; leadership potential; present involvement in Individual Psychology, if any; references.

In addition to the above, there are four tuition only scholarships for \$250 each. All
