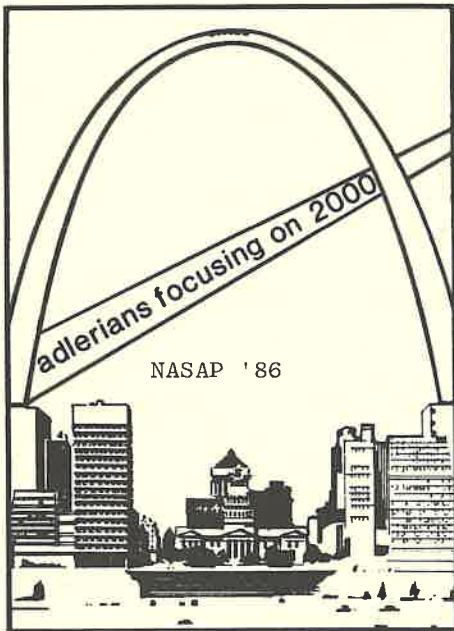

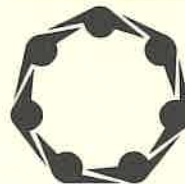

NEW TRAINING INSTITUTES...

Indianapolis

Dr. Joan Truit reports that the newly formed Alfred Adler Institute of Indianapolis (AII) will hold a Conference for Mental Health Professionals on November 22 and 23, 1985, at the Athletic Club in downtown Indianapolis. Speakers for the event are Dr. Harold Mosak presenting Life Style Assessment on Friday, November 22, and Dr. Kurt Adler presenting Depression and the Prevention of Suicide on Saturday, November 23. The registration fee is \$30 for each day or \$50 for both days.

AII will offer training in the principles and methods of Adlerian Psychology through its Schools of Graduate Study and Continuing Education. 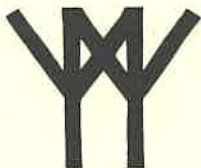

Ethel Quiring was a teacher in the Saskatoon schools until 1966, when she worked on a Master's of Arts degree in counseling. When she returned to Saskatoon she accepted the position of Guidance Counsellor at Walter Murray Collegiate and concentrated her professional growth and development in the area of Adlerian Psychology. She studied with Dr. Rudolf Dreikurs and spent two summers at the Alfred Adler Institute in Chicago. She helped found the Saskatoon Society for Adlerian Psychology and served as its chairperson for many years.

Ethel was, and is today, the principal Adlerian force in Saskatchewan and has been in demand as a lecturer, teacher and consultant for school systems throughout the province, for the University of Saskatchewan, the University of Regina, the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation and many other organizations. Most Adlerians in Saskatchewan were introduced to the psychology by Ethel. She opened the doors to Adlerian thought for hundreds of people.

Ethel will superannuate from her position as an itinerant counselor for the Saskatoon

Board of Education but will do some counseling and will continue her commitment to furthering the Adlerian movement in Saskatchewan.
