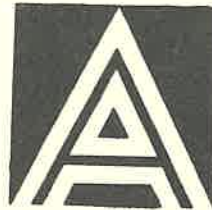

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PUBLICATION NEEDS SURVEY RESULTS

A preliminary evaluation of the responses to the NASAP Publication Needs Survey were recently completed by Tom Schramski of the Publications Committee. The evaluation includes the following:

1. Of the 40 responses, the vast majority were sent by Adlerians identifying themselves as individual and couple/family therapists.
2. A broad range of current publications were listed as "most useful." The Journal of Individual Psychology and Children: The Challenge were cited the most frequently.
3. Respondents requested more publications on applications in special areas--working with the disabled, businesses and organizations, and psychotherapeutic strategies for specific problems.
4. Many suggestions were given for reprinting various Adlerian classics including Dreikurs "Courage to be Imperfect" speech, selected essays by the Ansbachers, and specific JIP articles.
5. There was an overwhelming positive response in favor of NASAP publishing or marketing materials, particularly audio-visual materials and promotional products.
6. Though there was limited response to the question about overpublishing in Adlerian practice, several respondents noted an overabundance of materials on the 4 goals of misbehavior.

The Publications Committee wishes to express its appreciation for the responses received. During the May meeting in St. Louis these responses will be discussed and some specific publications or marketing projects will be developed.

NEW PUBLICATIONS

The third edition of the Adlerian Marriage Enrichment program "Couples Growing Together" has now been published as a kit. The first two editions were authored by Adlerian psychologist Clair Hawes. Now her counselor husband, Roland, has collaborated in compiling this third edition of a practical approach to enriching couple relationships. Communication is the focus of the first four sessions of the eight session program. In the second half of "Couples Growing Together" the emphasis is on problem solving, making use of the communication skills already learned.
