Though the fort itself was built at the strategic convergence of three rivers in Northeastern Indiana in 1794 and the town was incorporated in 1829, the Fort Wayne of the 1980's is new, nonetheless. Events during the past 10 years have changed the city forever.

According to articles in the July/August HORIZON, flood control, an aggressive economic development program, downtown revitalization and renewed community activism have created a new energy and determination. The city's midwestern heritage hasn't been sacrificed in the name of progress; it's been incorporated. Today Fort Wayne offers the best of both worlds--all the attractions of a big city, combined with the down-home warmth and friendliness of a small town.

The glittering new Hilton with its two fine restaurants and formal and informal lounges, blends gracefully into the Grand Wayne Center, a convention center opened in 1985. The Center is connected via a windowed walkway to the Embassy Theatre, which was restored to its original grandeur of the 30's. Adjacent to the theatre is the Botanical Conservatory, the only facility of its kind to be located in a central-city area.

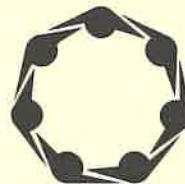

Source of "Suspension System"

When I developed my educational system, then known as Individual Education and now known as the Corsini Four-R School System, everything--except one part--came from my head as it were, based on inductive logical thinking relative to school type problems. The one part that I took from someone else was the Suspension System, which I adopted from the method that Dr. Rudolf Dreikurs suggested while I co-counseled with him.

Someone has challenged me, stating that he/she does not believe that Dr. Dreikurs ever used or suggested this method. To get evidence for the accuracy of my memory, I sent out two sets of letters to people believed to have knowledge of this matter. All those who did reply state they have no memory of Dr. Dreikurs ever making such suggestions.

Before I take credit for this suspension system, I wish to make an appeal to anyone who has any memory of Dr. Dreikurs advising how to deal with children who do not adjust to school by having their parents pick them up and take them home and keep them in their rooms for one or more days, etc.--what I call the "Dreikurs Suspension System." If you have any objective data to support your memory, say in writing, or know where records might be of his counseling at the Evanston Center about 1955, I would very much appreciate such information.

DANCE SYMPOSIUM

A weekend symposium entitled "Psychoanalytic Approaches to Dance/Movement Therapy" will be held April 4, 5, 1987, at the Wisconsin Center, Madison, Wisconsin.

Informed by different psychoanalytic schools of thought, three major dance/movement therapists have developed astute and innovative theories of interpretation and intervention, reports Deborah Thomas. They are: Penny Bernstein, who practices in Massachusetts, has extensively worked with and written on the theories of C. G. Jung. 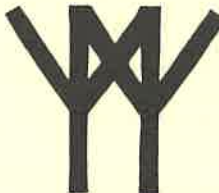

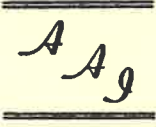
