COWS CAN BE PURPLE, Sadie "Tee" Dreikurs, Alfred Adler Institute of Chicago, paper back, 146 pages, \$7.95.

James Croake writes, "Those of us who have taken Sadie Dreikurs' courses over the years and used her methods believed that it was essential to put her teachings into print. Hence, Nancy Catlin and I undertook to interview Tee over the course of five years and to transcribe, edit and write Cows Can Be Purple."

"Sadie is, of course, the widow of the late Rudolf Dreikurs, the foremost student of Alfred Adler. Her methods are soundly grounded in Adlerian theory; albeit, she was influenced by her original training in social work with Jane Adams. Sadie is a recognized international artist having been trained at the Chicago Art Institute and having studied with the masters of the day in France and Germany. She is currently on the faculty and Board of Directors, Alfred Adler Institute of Chicago and Co-director of the International Committee for Adlerian Summer Schools and Institutes.

"Her text is of obvious interest to Adlerians due to her creative therapeutic skill which can be employed with or without art therapy. More importantly it is a guide to any therapist wishing to include art therapy in practice. Art therapists, regardless of their theoretical persuasion, will find this text a practical addition to their practice.

"Cows Can Be Purple begins with an autobiographical sketch and then moves into her method of art therapy. In highly organized fashion, Sadie takes the reader through exercises which can be used with those seeking an understanding of their life style, those experiencing life adjustment problems to those who would be diagnosed 'psychotic.' The majority of exercises are illustrated using groups. The same exercises can be applied to families, couples, and individuals. Pragmatic procedures are suggested for particular treatment populations.

"Throughout the text technical terms and Adlerian concepts are explicated. The use of the book, therefore, is an education in Adlerian theory and practice as well as art therapy. The final section is an editorial conclusion which points to the importance and timeliness of Cows Can Be Purple in light of recent trends in psychotherapy."

HANDBOOK OF STRUCTURED TECHNIQUES IN MARRIAGE & FAMILY THERAPY, Robert Sherman and Norman Fredman, Brunner/Mazel Publishers, 280 pages, \$27.50.

This well-organized, practical Handbook begins with the authors describing the place of structured techniques in therapy, the process of creating and choosing techniques, and current work in this increasingly important field.

Drs. Sherman and Fredman have selected 59 techniques that have been widely used by clinicians for diagnosis and intervention and have been reported to be useful and effective in the clinical setting. For each of the 59 techniques, the authors provide a succinct theoretical rationale, a set of procedures, a clinical case example, and resources for additional information.

AIAS ANNOUNCES A NEW DEADLINE FOR REGISTER

AIAS, Ltd. has announced a new deadline for inclusion in the Charter Edition of The Register of Adlerian Psychology Practitioners, the reference and referral source announced to NASAP members and 1,500 other Adlerians worldwide in a special mailing in December, 1986. 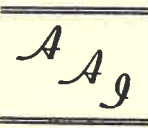
