#### Letters to the Editor

In the recent NASAP Newsletter you asked for suggestions for the use of the \$5,000.00 Carol Arnold estate donation to the Society.

Kurt Adler and Sophia de Vries have frequently emphasized the need to retranslate two of Alfred Adler's most important clinical works, The Neurotic Constitution and The Theory and Practice of Individual Psychology.

At the last meeting of the Clinical Section in Minneapolis, we voted to allocate some section funds to explore the publication of The Collected Works of Alfred Adler. Daronda Blevins and I are spearheading this project. It will take a lot of money and time to complete.

I propose that we allocate the \$5,000.00 from the Carol Arnold estate and an additional \$8,500.00 from other available sources to contract the retranslation of Alfred Adler's The Neurotic Constitution. Professional translating costs about \$30.00/page. The book is 450 pages, so it would cost about \$13,500.00. I could secure a translator, but the work should be done under the direct supervision of Kurt Adler.

A superb new translation of <u>The Neurotic</u> <u>Constitution</u> would help vitalize the "Collected Works" project.

I urge you to give this proposal a high priority. Our Society needs meaningful projects to promote. Our prime responsibility should be to make Alfred Adler's original teachings readily available. Most of his work is out of print. I would love to see NASAP devote every spare dollar to translating, re-translating, and publishing all of Adler's writings. What else is this important?
