NASAP's 1994 Convention will be held in San Diego at the Doubletree Hotel at Horton Plaza, May 19-22. Theme for the four day event will be *Enhancing the Quality of Life -- Contemporary Adlerian Perspective*.

Workshop and convention presentation proposal forms have been mailed to all NASAP members. One-day workshops are scheduled for Thursday and Sunday, May 19 and 22 and convention presentations for Friday and Saturday, May 20-21. Priority will be given to proposals related to the convention theme.

Submission deadline for workshops is September 22 and convention program, October 8. Additional proposal forms are available from the central office.

Lois Nugent, Chairman of the local San Diego Convention Committee, provided Toronto conventioners with this poetic invitation. The Newsletter extends it to the rest of the membership:

President's Message:

Enthusiasm Pervades '93 Convention

Excellent presentations and a good feeling among participants characterized the Annual Convention and Workshops in Toronto June 10 to 13. I am once again reminded that NASAP is fortunate to have such talented people who are willing to share their knowledge and experience. And it isn't just the presenters, those who attend contribute so much by their active participation. **Judge Wendy Cooley** delivered a very positive, inspiring, "from the heart" keynote and decided to join NASAP and attend the NASAP Convention in San Diego May 19 to 22, 1994. The Delegate Assembly worked through a very busy agenda with amazing speed. The D.A. is pleased that their fiscal restraint this past year has kept the budget out of the red to this point. NASAP membership is up again this year with all but one region showing an increase. It is important to note that this increase came during a poor economy.

The Long Range Planning Committee presented their report to the Development Committee and the D.A. will debate and add their input at a special extended 2 1/2 day meeting in November. Following that, the input of the General Membership will be solicited so that concrete actions can begin. I am again reminded of how fortunate we are to have people in NASAP who are so willing to devote their valuable time and, at the same time, to pick up all or most of their own expenses in order to move Adlerian psychology forward. Thank you!

The Social Equality-Diversity Section was approved and a steering committee established to run affairs until the 50 paid members can be signed to allow elections to take place. Judging by the enthusiasm of the large group which met during the Section meetings, I have no doubt that it will only be a short time before all constitutional requirements are met.

The Adler Dreikurs Century Fund was initiated officially in Toronto. The Endowment Committee, with **Ed Abelson** as chair, have put a great deal of effort and thought into this project. It is a great opportunity for Adlerians who wish to give money which will be preserved in perpetuity while the interest is used to advance Adlerian psychology.

Upon the recommendation of the Region 3 (South) meeting in Toronto, I have appointed **John Arnold** of Columbia, SC to serve out the 18 months remaining in the term of **James Croake** as the representative to the D.A. John has been very active in promoting Adlerian psychology in South Carolina and we are pleased he has agreed to serve.

Toronto Convention Highlights

Two long-time contributors to Individual Psychology were honored in Toronto:

Liliane F. Bensinger was presented with a plaque at the banquet in recognition of her contributions as a counselor and educator and as a founder and organizer of both an association and a training institute in Montreal. Liliane has been a member of NASAP since 1973, having been introduced to Individual Psychology by the Ansbachers. She served on the Delegate Assembly from 1979-1986.

Edith A. Dewey was the recipient of a plaque in recognition of her contributions as a counselor, teacher, group leader, writer, and founder and organizer of Adlerian organizations in Ontario and Delaware. Edith has been a member of NASAP since 1965 and served on the Delegate Assembly from 1977-1983. Under her leadership, a Convention/Workshop Guidelines Manual was developed to assist local host groups.

Edith was hospitalized shortly before the convention and the plaque was presented to her in her hospital room. Edith has an inoperable brain tumor and is in the Palliative Care Unit of Sunny Brook Health Science Center, 2075 Bayview Ave., LG Wing, Toronto, ON M4N 3M5.

Region Reports

Region II (Midwest) reported that a number of motions were made at their convention meeting June 12 which recommend the following:

1. The Long Range Planning Committee publish their mission statement and recommendations for NASAP's future in the Newsletter to facilitate input from the membership-at-large.

2. The Executive Committee and Delegate Assembly report agenda items before their meetings and decisions regarding these items after the meetings in the Newsletter for general membership input.

3. NASAP invite "our beloved and classic Adlerians" to present the keynote address or keynote panel at future conventions and that they be paid as any keynote speakers.

Region III (South) reports a discussion regarding the possibility of hosting a future annual NASAP convention. Questions were raised requiring D.A. consideration, including: lowering registration fees, changing the time of year, more presentations featuring demonstrations, more "distinctly Adlerian" themes, and a paid local coordinator.

Elder Mel Elliot spoke of forgiving and blessing your fellow humans. The inspirational session provided an appropriate conclusion by epitomizing the convention theme -- "Celebrate Diversity, Encourage Connection".

Call For Journal Editor

A call for applications is being issued for Editor of the Practice and Application issues of **Individual Psychology**. Jon Carlson's term as Editor of these issues expires December 31, 1995.

The NASAP quarterly Journal publishes two Practice and Application issues each year, alternating with two Theory and Research issues. The Editor's term is six years and is renewable upon reapplication and approval of the Delegate Assembly. A modest annual stipend for expenses is available to the Editor.

Candidates must be members of NASAP; should show evidence of substantial Adlerian activity: e.g., presentations at meetings, workshops, publications, etc.; should have an academic background and evidence of clerical support; and must accept the purposes of the Journal as stated in the Guidelines.

Interested applicants are asked to submit three copies of a vita with the statement of interest to the Central Office, address on page two. Deadline for applications is May, 1994.

In Memoriam - Harold V. McAbee

Harold V. McAbee died May 24, 1993, after a long illness. The Adlerian community has been the recipient of many years of Hal's Social Interest, not only in his local area and Region IV, but also nationally and internationally. He joined NASAP in 1971, served on the Delegate Assembly from 1976-80, was President of the Society in 1978-79. Hal served as ICASSI Administrator from 1976-87. He was Secretary-General of the International Association of Individual Psychology from 1979-80 and was elected President of IAIP in 1990.

Hal was very active in D.C. and Maryland area organizations, including the Adler-Dreikurs Institute of Human Relations, where he was a faculty member and Director for many years. His most recent academic venture was the establishment of a Doctoral Program in Adlerian Psychology through the Union Institute Graduate School.

In these various capacities, Hal was exceptionally generous and touched many lives, serving as a mentor, counselor, colleague, advisor and friend. To say he will be missed is an under-statement.
